

It's hard work...

Part of the fun of going on vacation is not having to cook or clean the place for a while . Nevertheless, somebody must take care of it. This is why I always leave a decent tip to hotel housekeepers. Not only do they do the hotel's hard work, but contrary to waiters who systematically get tips, housekeepers are often forgotten, the 'invisible' face behind our comfort.

How long does it take to clean a hotel room? 1,2,3,4,5,6

Housekeeping is a cornerstone of guest satisfaction (85% of guests cite cleanliness as their focus when reading reviews). A hotel room can play

host to hundreds of different guests each year, so it falls to housekeepers to ensure that there is no evidence of previous occupants.

On average, it takes 20-30 minutes to clean a standard room. This includes making the bed, dusting surfaces, vacuuming or mopping the floor, cleaning the bathroom, restocking amenities and ensuring that everything is in its place.

Many factors can increase the time needed to clean a room:

- Frequency of cleaning if a housekeeper cleans a room daily, it will take less time and effort than if the cleaning occurs weekly.
- Number of housekeepers if the hotel is understaffed, it may take longer to clean each room, resulting in delays in preparing rooms for new guests.
- Room size larger rooms (like suites) take more time to clean.
- Amenities and Features rooms with additional amenities like Jacuzzis demand extra attention.
- Mess left by previous guest if a guest leaves dirty dishes, trash, or stains on the furniture or carpet it will take longer to get the room clean.
- Need for maintenance fixes a broken light or air conditioner can extend the cleaning time as housekeepers may need to coordinate with maintenance personnel or fix minor issues themselves.

Number of rooms cleaned per housekeeper⁷

On average, over the course of a typical eight-hour shift, a housekeeper will clean between 10 and 15 rooms. At some hotels, they'll clean as many as 30.

Industry recommendations suggest that for every 10 rooms in a three-star hotel the number of housekeepers needed is eight, in a four-star hotel it is twelve, and in a five-star hotel, twenty. Ultimately, the housekeeping team size depends on operational needs, brand and quality standards, as well as budget.

Living dangerously^{8,9}

Housekeeping is among the toughest jobs in the hospitality industry. The International Union of Food, Agricultural, Hotel, Restaurant, Catering, Tobacco and Allied Workers Associations (IUF) says that housekeepers have a 40% higher risk of injury than those working in any other type of service profession.

In a survey of more than 600 hotel housekeepers in the U.S. and Canada, 91% said they had suffered work-related pain. Of those, 77% said their pain interfered with routine activities. Two out of every three workers visited their doctor to deal with workplace pain and 66% took pain medication to get through their daily work.
